ABBA Foundation: Renewing the Land, Renewing the People

For close to fifteen years, ABBA Foundation has carried a simple but deeply rooted purpose: to be the hands and feet of Jesus Christ. Our work is grounded in the words of Jesus in **Matthew 25**, where He says, “I was hungry and you gave Me food, I was thirsty and you gave Me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed Me, I was naked and you clothed Me, I was sick and you visited Me, I was in prison and you came to Me.”

This is the heart of ABBA Foundation. We exist to serve Christ by serving people and allowing Christ to work through us. Our mission is not only to meet immediate needs, but to lead people into a living relationship with God, to disciple them, and to help them become disciples who can disciple others.

At the centre of this calling is agriculture.

Agriculture gives us something unique. Unlike a church service where people may gather for an hour on a Sunday, agriculture places us alongside men and women five to six days a week, working together in the field, sharing life, building trust, teaching, learning, praying, and walking alongside people in a deeply practical way. The field becomes a place of discipleship. It becomes a place where lives are restored, families are strengthened, communities are developed, and people begin to understand that they have both value and purpose in the Kingdom of God.

We believe that **if we can renew the land, we can renew the people.**

ABBA Foundation uses agriculture as a foundation for transformation across Africa. Through our **ABBA Farming Ministry**, we establish commercial farming operations that are designed to become financially regenerative over time. Depending on the crop, variety, and farming model, these farms are built with the aim of becoming regenerative within approximately five to seven years. Once established, they become more than farms. They become centres of training, discipleship, aggregation, and support for surrounding communities.

The purpose of the base farm is not simply to farmland. The purpose of the base farm is to **create farmers in the community.**

A project may begin with 10 hectares, but the vision is much larger. As people are trained, disciplined, and equipped, they begin farming their own land. Over time, this creates an expanding agricultural footprint where hundreds and eventually

thousands of hectares can be cultivated through a shared support structure, shared values, shared training, and shared access to seedlings (inputs), advice, markets, and mentorship.

Our vision is to work with communities, churches, ministries, and African governments to help reshape the agricultural landscape of nations. Through **ABBA Ignite** (a vision sharing Community gathering centre on the outskirts of Johannesburg, South Africa), we aim to engage with governments across Africa to demonstrate how agricultural footprints can be developed in a way that restores dignity, strengthens food security, creates economic opportunity, and brings the Gospel into the daily life of communities.

Alongside our commercial farming model, ABBA Foundation also runs a growing community and home gardens programme. These gardens are designed to address household food security in a practical and scalable way. We develop example gardens, train community members, and provide the support needed for families to begin growing food at home. What began with only a few home gardens has grown into thousands of home gardens, supported by the distribution of approximately **150,000 seedlings three times per year producing on average 900 tons of fresh produce a year in these communities.**

In addition to this, we have developed the **ABBA Urban Chicken Model**, where we train urban chicken farmers and equip them to create small-scale poultry enterprises. This provides families with both food and income potential, while also creating another practical platform for discipleship, mentorship, and entrepreneurship.

Education is another critical part of our work. In Zambia, Liseli Farms an ABBA Farm runs a school, where children receive access to education in an environment shaped by Christian values, agricultural exposure, and community upliftment. In South Africa, we also support Lesedi Pre Primary School as part of our broader commitment to seeing children receive the opportunity to learn, grow, and develop into the people God has called them to be.

ABBA Foundation is also active in renewable energy. Wherever possible, we work to move our projects and facilities onto solar power, creating more sustainable and resilient operations. This is especially important in rural and under-resourced areas where energy instability can limit education, healthcare, food production, and enterprise development.

Our container bakery model is another example of how we combine practical enterprise with community care. These bakeries generate income through the sale of bread, but they also create a way for people to “buy bread forward” for vulnerable

communities. Through partnerships with local churches, bread is distributed to those who are hungry, ensuring that the local church remains central in serving and caring for its own community.

Water is also a major focus area. Through our water programme, we assist communities with access to boreholes, wells, and sustainable water solutions. Water is foundational to life, health, farming, and dignity. Without water, communities struggle to grow food, maintain health, or build sustainable livelihoods. By helping communities access water, we help unlock the possibility of long-term transformation.

Healthcare forms another part of our holistic model. We work with churches and communities to train people in basic home-based care, helping communities learn how to care for the sick, the vulnerable, and the elderly among them. This reflects the Matthew 25 calling in a deeply practical way, where care is not outsourced, but restored within the community itself.

ABBA Foundation also supports entrepreneurship development and internship programmes across the different disciplines of our work. These programmes create pathways for young people and community members to gain practical experience in agriculture, education, healthcare, renewable energy, enterprise, and community development. Our aim is to raise up capable, Christ-centred leaders who can carry the work forward in their own communities.

In addition to long-term development, we also run a relief and aid programme. This programme allows us to respond to urgent and immediate needs where people require help quickly. While our main focus is sustainable transformation, we understand that there are moments where people need immediate food, care, clothing, shelter, support, or intervention. In those moments, we seek to respond with compassion and urgency.

The work of ABBA Foundation is broad, but it is not disconnected. Every ministry flows from the same conviction: that Jesus Christ is Lord, that people matter deeply to God, and that the restoration of communities must involve both spiritual discipleship and practical transformation.

We do not believe Africa lacks potential. We believe Africa is filled with land, people, gifts, resources, and opportunity. What is needed is a model that can bring these together under the Lordship of Christ, with integrity, stewardship, training, and long-term commitment.

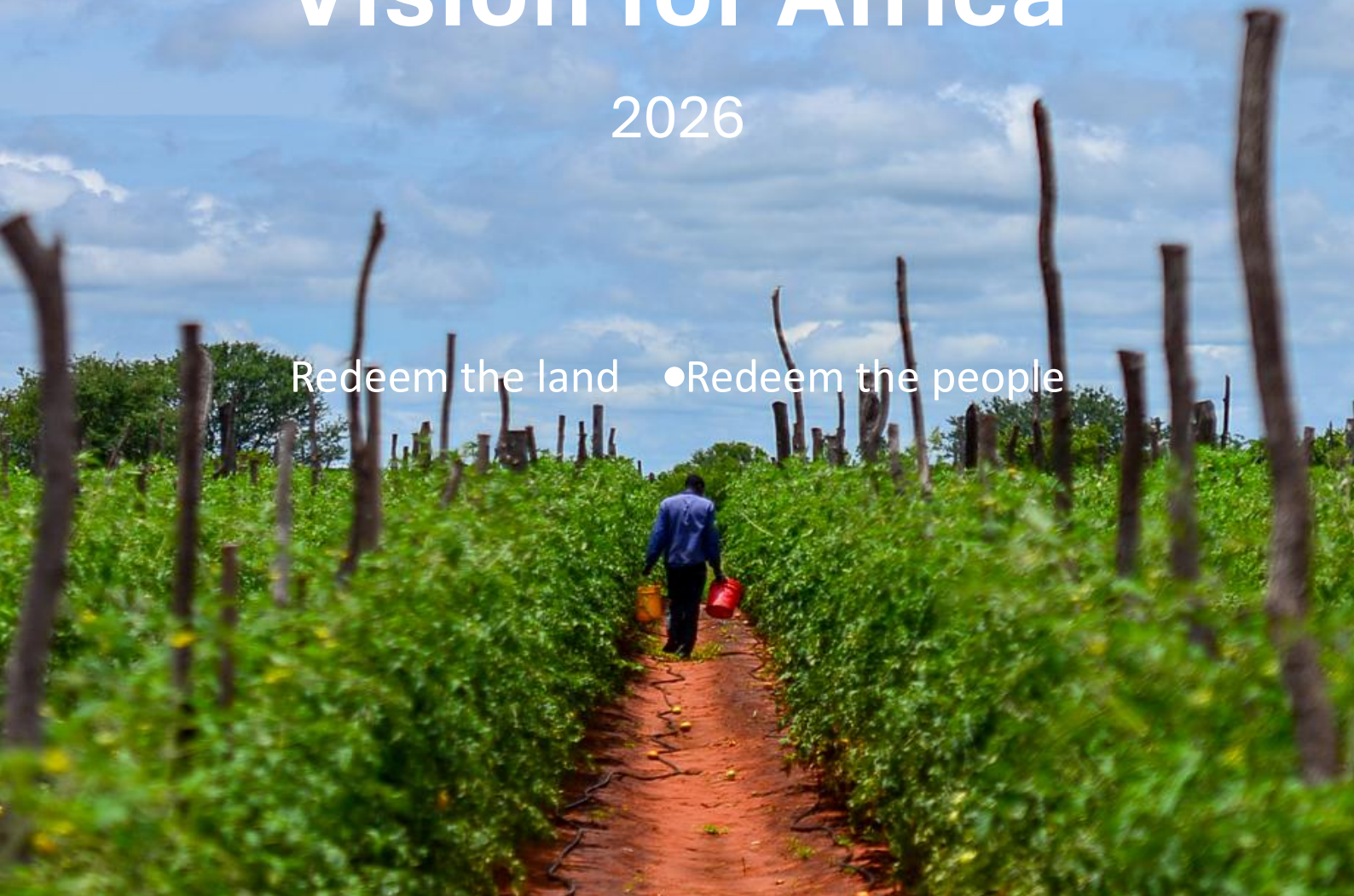

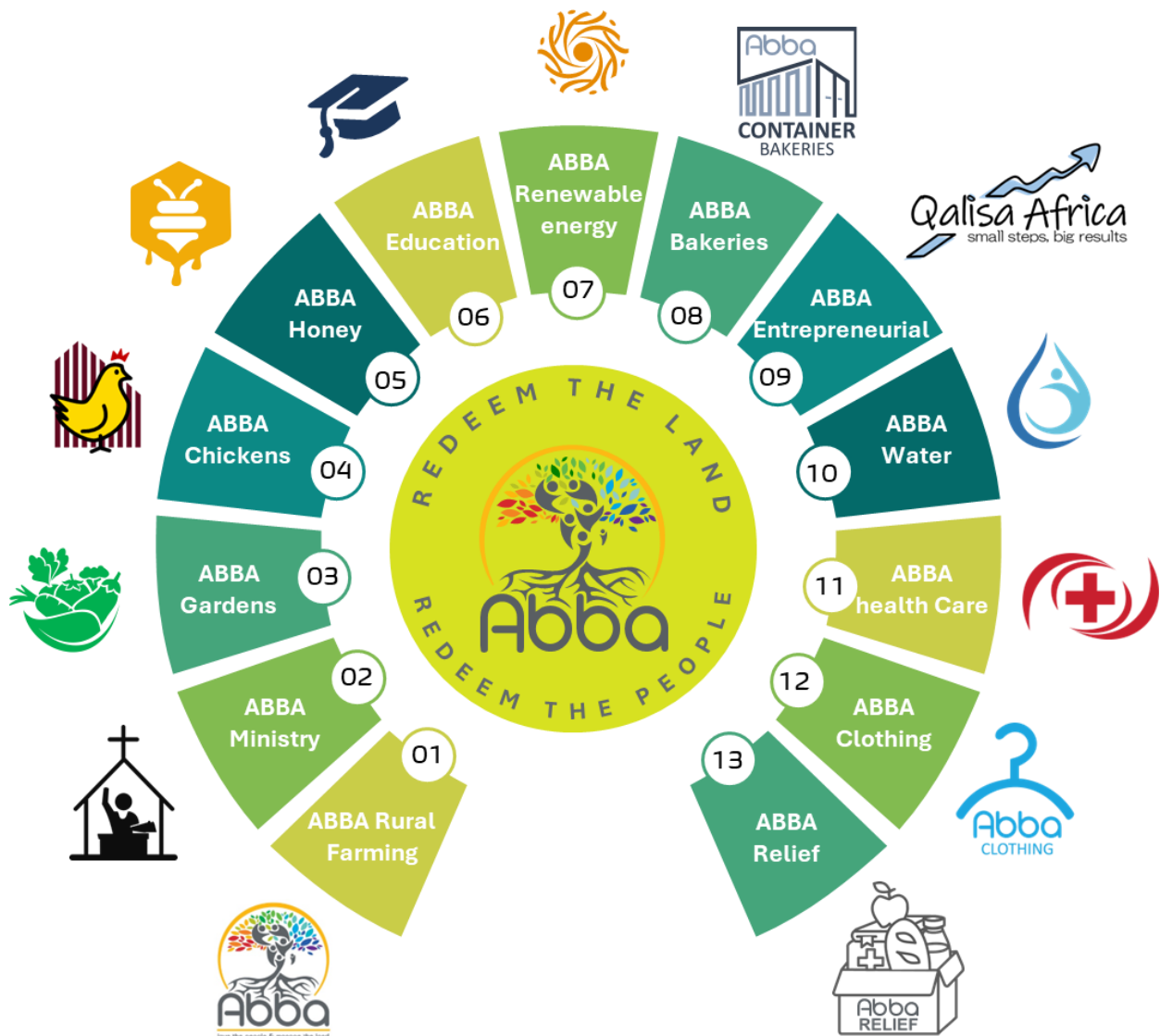

ABBA MINISTRIES

The Foundation is centered around the following Ministries and brief highlights of each follow below:



1. ABBA RURAL FARMING



#RestoreTheLandRestoreThePeople - ABBA Rural

Farming Model is the backbone of the ABBA Model, and the agricultural component will see each project become Regenerative and GOD sustainable. Once an ABBA Farm is established it allows us to love on the community through the above ministries. It also allows us to Disciple those willing to be discipled and to multiply not only the Church but also Farmers. Which will see the Church (The Body / Individuals) taking charge of the Stewardship of land and not only building a strong Church but addressing Africa's greatest Challenges being Hunger, Poverty, Education, Water, Sanitation, Power, Health Care etc.

We have seen this come alive through our ABBA model at Liseli Farms Zambia, where we have literally seen GOD make the impossible possible. GOD gave the Vision and HE has made it happen. The farm starting with 2 ha is now over 980 ha, with commercial cropping of approximately 50ha Citrus, Pecans, Tomatoes and Watermelon and we trust to establish 100ha of Mangoes in 2026/2027. The Agricultural project not only acts as a training ground to develop Commercial Farmers but is also a source of income to keep all other Ministries and Ministry activities funded. A fully operational Clinic and School and a thriving Discipleship Model is seeing people and communities being restored by the Holy Spirit.

As part of the ABBA Rural farming model, we have been very focused on ABBA Ignite in Venterspos, West of Johannesburg, South Africa. ABBA Foundation has been entrusted with this 20-hectare farm, which we believe will become a centre of restoration, discipleship, and agricultural transformation for Africa. The vision is to create a living model that demonstrates how land, when stewarded correctly, can renew both communities and individuals. Through commercial citrus farming, high-value vegetable production, poultry, honey, grain cultivation, and food preservation practices, the farm will showcase practical, sustainable agriculture that can be replicated across the continent. More importantly, it will serve as a place where African leaders, landowners, and emerging farmers can gather to learn, be equipped, and return to their communities with the tools and knowledge needed to create lasting change.

At the heart of this initiative is the belief that true transformation is both practical and spiritual. The property includes a 40-room facility capable of hosting up to 80 people at a time, which we aim to restore into a training and discipleship centre. Here, individuals will not only learn how to farm and steward resources effectively, but also how to build communities rooted in responsibility, mentorship, and the love of God.

This initiative builds on the work already underway through our established project in Zambia and is intended to become a demonstration hub where governments,

partners, and stakeholders can experience a scalable model for sustainable agricultural and community development.

We are inviting donors and partners to join us in bringing this vision to life. This is more than an investment into land or infrastructure; it is an opportunity to sow into a model that restores land, restores people, and creates generational impact across Africa. By equipping communities, activating underutilised land, and connecting producers to meaningful economic opportunities, we believe Africa can rise into its calling as a place of abundance and provision for the world.

The redemption of the land leads to the redeeming of the people. The ABBA rural farming initiative is the driver for all other ABBA ministries. Redemption of the land creates regeneration as the land yields crops which can be sold to fund ongoing ministry efforts and expansion. Africa is the perfect springboard for this ministry as according to an FAO report; Africa has 874 million hectares of arable land of which 13 million has direct access to water.



To develop one hectare of greenfield land, will cost between approximately \$50,000 per hectare to develop for high value long term crops. However, this becomes regenerative after three to eight years with a potential income of anything between \$8,000 and \$20,000 per hectare. With all earnings going back into the communities or expansion of the vision.

- Liseli 900 Ha. (with water)

ACQUIRE EXISTING FARMS – SOUTH AFRICA



Greenfields development will take time to get to a commercial producing level. An additional strategy in South Africa would be to utilise the current legislation in terms of Black Economic Empowerment to obtain shares in existing operational farms as a level 1 BEE foundation. ABBA will become the BEE partner to the farm and thereby affording the farmer up to a level 1 BEE status, dependant on the structure adopted. Farmers don't always have the time or resources to assist and develop the community around them and the Abba figure can help with that. Dividends will provide the money to not only fund the project but to expand the Vision. We work on Kingdom principles – tithes plus first fruits go to the foundation, bulk goes back into communities. The farmer will continue with his activities, and we are his Kingdom partner building the communities around him into thriving Spirit filled communities who farm and steward the land bringing economic transformation.

Acquisition Cost with Immediate Income Potential = Range \$1 500,000 – \$ 5 000 000 per Est Farm

2. ABBA Ministry

#THEWORD - The Word and spreading the Word of GOD remains a central focus of ABBA. The ABBA model is based on discipleship rooted in the Word of GOD. The ABBA team support the local churches and pastors in the various communities in both lifting up the ministry team as well as assisting in ministry activities such as sharing the Word, counselling, teaching, etc.

3. ABBA GARDENS

#FoodSecurity#Dignity - Starting with a couple of Home Gardens in Tembisa in 2018, and then 200 seedlings in Zenzele during COVID 2020, never despise the day of small beginnings, it is with great joy and excitement that we can announce that our garden program continues to explode, and we are able to reach so many more people than before. We now have dedicated agronomists for our farmers, and the training programs and new farmer training days have intensified with the ability to add so many more subsistence farmers to our program.



This initiative is so dear to our hearts, and we have many testimonies of how lives have changed because of this. We have over 500 Community gardens servicing

more than 5000 Home Gardens. We distribute on average around between 80 000 to 150 000 Seedlings now three times a year with spring and summer plantings and one winter planting, which equates to an excess of 250 000 kgs of fresh produce being produced by the people, for the people.



An ABBA community gardens is a training garden with a dedicated Influencer caring for the garden and training community members in sustainable home farming. The establishment costs (fencing, ploughing, walkways, garden chapel, etc.), seedlings / seed (planting three times a year which creates a continuous harvesting cycle), fertilizers, worm farm and compost heap, neem oils, maintenance, etc. is +/- \$10,000.

4. ABBA Urban Chickens

#FightingPovertyFightingMalnutrition – Layers and broilers.

Urban model allows the poorest to farm chickens for meat and eggs and gives them protein in their diet. The Community Free Range Coop allows for income generation whilst training small scale urban farmers. Our 64-chicken layer model truly creates a small-scale livestock farmer with enough potential income to feed the family. Manure is used to feed the compost heap which in turn keeps the vegetable garden producing vegetables organically.

5. ABBA Honey

We are in a unique position to have access to Villages and people in the forests of Zambia. This is an incredible opportunity to Minister to these people groups whilst creating a fair environment to assist them in formalising a market for their honey which would create economic transformation as they are Spiritually transformed through the WORD. There are commercial quantities of raw organic honey available in these forests harvested by these communities. We are looking for a market in the USA and would need to bottle at destination. We welcome partners to unlock this incredible opportunity to touch the lives of thousands whilst seeing them transformed holistically.

6. ABBA Education

#ChildrenOnTheMove - Education is one of the keys to the transformation of Communities and is a generational blessing. ABBA through Liseli Farms in Zambia has a thriving school looking after the grounding and transformative years of our next generation. This school has the potential to grow exponentially and transform more lives. Together with this we are also actively supporting Lesedi Pre-Primary school in Zenzele.

7. ABBA Renewable Energy

#SustainablePower – At our Urban ABBA in Zenzele we've experienced regular power cuts lasting up to two weeks and the solar system has really shown its worth as there was nonstop production. We feel so fortunate to have this system as even church services and other events have not been impacted at all by the inconsistent power supplied by Eskom.



We are also excited to report that we have been able to keep our bakery bread price at R10 despite ingredient price increases, making fresh, hot bread affordable and available to our community. It continues to support our church, gardens and water availability to the community 24/7.

8. ABBA Container Bakeries

#BreadofLife - The renewable power source continues to be a game changer for the bakery and again this year uninterrupted baking. For the year March 2024 to February 2025, we baked a total of 51,069 Breads. With this, we have fed 6,517 destitute families who also received ministering, and testimonies continue pouring in. 44,552 fresh hot breads were made available to the community to purchase at R10 a bread. There was a considerable drop in terms of bread baked this year and there are 2 major factors that have contributed to this, firstly we need to delivery further and are trusting for a Delivery Bike and secondly, the depletion of our Buy Bread Forward campaign.



We are currently working hard on our Buy a Bread Forward Campaign as we believe this is pivotal in engaging the community and a way for us to minister to people who live under very difficult circumstances. At ABBA, we believe it is very important to show love to people in a practical way and Buy a Bread forward is exactly that. We remain passionate about sustaining and even expanding this program.

Zenzele bakery continues to be used for training new bakers and possible expansion.

9. Qalisa Africa

#GivingARod - We are excited to identify new entrepreneurs to access the Qalisa Africa program, we believe that as we assist people little by little it will eventually have a great impact. With the help of our local church community, we also aim to develop the so-called soft skills of the entrepreneurs for example good communication and interpersonal skills, problem solving, work ethic, time management and teamwork.



These skills will go a long way to paving the way to success for these budding entrepreneurs. Small business is such a vital part of the economy in South Africa, and we are proud to play a small part in this sector.

10. ABBA Water

#WaterIsLife - Our ongoing passion to support communities with water continues. We locate and drill for underground water wells, develop water infrastructure to ensure community access, do the testing and grading of the water to ensure the water is fit for human consumption as well as look at irrigation systems to support the garden projects in the Community. We are delivering fresh drinking water to thousands of people, and we must never forget access to water equals access to agriculture and food security.



With this access to water an opportunity exists to bottle water and sell it to support the ministry, through a bottling plant. We have a market and space for the bottling plant at ABBA Ignite and Zenzele.

11. ABBA Healthcare

#WhenIWasSick – Health Care is one of our pillars and to this end we are so grateful for the operationality of the Liseli Farms Zambia Healing Centre (Clinic) this year. All equipment from Project Cure was received for the healing center and the rest distributed to two local clinics. We are now able to effectively serve the sick in our community and beyond.



We have had an amazing year where our Community Orientated Primary Care (COPC) students not only graduated but also completed their year of Community Service and looking after the sick within our community. There are also some of the students that have found placements at clinics in the area. The importance of this program cannot be underestimated, and we will do everything in our power to ensure the continuation of this program as well as the building of a small clinic to house this very important ministry.

To compliment this initiative and get it to a regenerative state where it can start funding its own growth, we have an opportunity in Partnership with two medical foundations who have pledged their support. We are looking at building a Medical Training Facility on ABBA Ignite. Our Contribution will be the Training facility they would make all the medical equipment required available as well as the Doctors required to run the facility and do the training.

12. ABBA Clothing

#WhenIwasNaked - ABBA Clothing continues to minister to the communities we are involved in. We continue looking for opportunities to clothe our communities with dignity.



The aim is to expand the “Retail” footprint and get ladies into retail jobs. We buy the clothing from large retailers that have end of line stock, a small markup allow us to sell new clothes at incredible prices compared to ‘normal’ retail stores. Our first retail store in Zenzele is in a converted shipping container. We believe these shops will lead to a retail hub selling all types of goods. This provides dignity to the community as Parents can clothe their children at a fraction of real cost and at the same time we can use it as a ministry tool into the community ministering to those people that are not yet attending one of our services.

13. ABBA Aid Relief

#LoveInAction – As a team we are excited to say that our maize distribution in conjunction with our wonderful partner Pride Milling has grown and expanded. We have regular collections and deliveries of maize to assist the poorest communities with something nutritious to eat on a regular basis. The program was only able to expand because of community involvement and distribution partners that really want to see a change in their respective communities. We are happy to say that the maize distribution is not just a once-off relief effort but regular assistance for those who are identified as needy and unable to assist themselves. We are also able to assist with immediate once-off relief efforts as the need arises because of the generosity of Pride Milling and we are truly blessed to be in this situation. However, the maize is not a standalone program but is complimented by our community gardens, home gardens and other relief programs.



We continue supporting soup kitchens in Zenzele and Bekkersdal and our bakery continues to have an incredible impact on our community.

Happy to announce the feeding program in Zambia in conjunction with Convoy of Hope is up and running and hoping to soon expand that to ABBA Ignite and Zenzele in South Africa.

We have continued our scholarships, ministry activities, food parcels and medical care outside of the COPC. We are still extremely excited about our ambassador program. On that note, it is with great excitement we announce our latest Ambassador Abigail Du Preez based in Houston, Texas.

14. ABBA Team and foundation running costs

#Holistic – Our internship program in conjunction with the South African Government and Investec Bank is still running strong, and we feel is really making a difference. To date we have registered 206 interns in various disciplines such as Baking, Gardens, Ministry, Hospital Ministry, Retail, administration, entrepreneurship, building, social services, healthcare, education, farming etc... This is making a huge difference within our communities and creating skills which lead to employment opportunities.

People are learning a diverse set of skills in various sectors, and this is encouraging because equipping someone is a set up for success in future employment. With such a high unemployment rate in South Africa many people rely on the informal sector for an income, and we believe it is empowering to have new skills. People can provide for their families and this in turn is such a good example for the next generation. Work should heal people and with new skills you will have the confidence to go out and be productive.
